- (a) A sound judicial system, among other things, needs to have two basic elements: a well-planned, well-regulated and well-ordered system of courts following a simply definite and scientific procedure and a body of law, expressed in simple words, definite, easily ascertainable and uniform, as far as possible. Without a good system of law, the courts however, the light fully planned, will administer justice according to the whims, discretion, notice of goods and bad, entertained by the presiding judge. Since these subjective elements differ from a man to man and time to time justice without law tends to be haphazard, inconsistent and indefinite. A court dispensing justice not according to what the judge deems just in a particular case cannot be an efficient or trust worthy tribunal. These would also be chances of corruption and bribery in such a situation. Law imparts uniformity and certainty to the administration of justice and protects the foundation of justice from being polluted by operation of improper motives or errors of what extent the Indian citizens are conscious towards this. If people have power to control their elected leaders, any administrator may not afford to go against these principles.
